Louise's creations have graced heads in the UK, Dubai, and Australia, including a fruitful collaboration with Hugo Boss Melbourne. As a distinguished millinery teacher, she has shared her expertise globally, from the UK to America. In 2021, she earned her rightful place in the Millinery Association of Australia's Hall of Fame, a testament to her invaluable contributions to the industry. Louise's millinery artistry is characterized by its exquisite, signature blend of movement and delicate femininity, consistently delivering impeccable quality and finish.

Education: Louise trained in Costume Interpretation at Wimbledon School of Art in London, UK, before going on to work as a costume milliner in London for 5 years. She is now a well known millinery educator teaching around the world through the online Hatacademy platform and in person in the USA (Millinery Meet Up), UK and Australia.








She is known for collaborations with fashion brand Hugo Boss, Melbourne and for her influence on modern Australian millinery.


